MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS IN PURGATORY

"*Why do Catholics pray for the dead?*" is a question frequently asked by our non-Catholic friends. Since the practice of praying for the Souls of the deceased is based upon the doctrine of Purgatory, which was abandoned by the Protestant Reformation in the 16th Century, naturally our Protestant friends are at a loss to understand the Catholic custom of praying for their departed brothers. The Church keeps this Devotion before the eyes of Her children by setting aside November 2nd as All Souls Day, permitting Her Priests to celebrate three Masses on that day for the Souls of the departed and by designating the entire month of November as the month of special Devotion for the Souls in Purgatory. Here, At St. Gianna Parish, the following Masses will be offered for the Holy Souls in Purgatory on All Souls Day.

SCHEDULE OF MASSES ALL SOULS DAY

8:30 AM - 12 NOON - 7:00 PM SOLEMN REQUIEM MASS

We will be remembering all those Holy Souls that are listed on the All Souls envelopes at all the Masses celebrated here during the month of November.

IN THE BIBLE

The Bible encourages us to pray not only for one another on earth, but to pray for the Souls of our departed as well. In the Second Book of Macabees of the Old Testament, it is narrated that after Judas Macabees defeated Gorgias, he came with his Company to bury the Jews slain in battle.

"Taking a collection, he sent 12,000 drachmas of silver to Jerusalem for sacrifice to be offered for the sins of the dead." He did not regard their sins to be grievous "because he considered that they who had fallen asleep with Godliness had great grace laid up for them." The Sacred Scripture writer then expresses the Doctrine involved herein: "*It is, therefore, a Holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from their sins*" MC 12: 43-46. While our brethren do not acknowledge the Book of Macabees to be inspired, they must at least admit them to be faithful, historical records that bear witness to the Jewish Faith centuries before Christ. As a matter of fact, they rest upon the same authority as Isaiah, St. John and all the other Books in the Bible – the infallible teaching authority of the Church, which has declared all the books of the Bible to be inspired.

Praying for the dead is the unanimous interpretation for the Fathers of the early Church and the continuing Tradition of the intervening centuries. There are numerous inscriptions on the tombs of the Martyrs, the tombs in the catacombs: "In your prayers remember us who have gone before you." "May you have eternal light in Christ" was the answering prayer of those who remained behind.

Some writings in the Early Church: Tertullian (160-240) writes – "We make on one day every year oblations for the dead as for their birthdays." St. Ambrose – "Give perfect rest to thy servant Theodosius, that rest which you have proposed for your Saints..." One of the most touching incidents which have come down to us from the writings of the Fathers upon this subject is from the pen of St. Augustine, who lived in the beginning of the 5th Century.

St. Augustine related that when his mother was dying, she made this last request of him: "Lay this body anywhere. This only I request of you — that you would remember me at the Altar of the Lord, wherever you be." We, Catholics, have kept the practice of prayer for the Souls in Purgatory from the very beginning even until now because it is the teaching of the Church who speaks for Christ.

What a beautiful and consoling doctrine Purgatory is — that we can reach out to those whom we love that we can transcend time and eternity and touch those who have gone before us with our prayers and Masses we have offered for them. At every Mass we are made present to the Passion, Death, Resurrection of Christ and the fruits, graces and blessings that Jesus won from His Heavenly Father by His Death on the Cross are applied both to the living and to the dead. And, so, the Masses we have offered and the prayers we pray for those who have gone before us touch them with the redemption of Christ, touch them with the salvation Christ won for them to enable them to get to Heaven. Perhaps you have already heard this story:

One day a wounded soldier lay dying, blood flowing from a frightful wound in his left shoulder. The blood was almost drained from his veins...A fellow soldier went up to the doctor (who despaired of saving his patient) and offered his blood to save the victim. The surgeon at once made the necessary incision, linking up the healthy man's arm with that of the wounded soldier. The strong man's blood passed into the weakened body, life took over, and the wounded lad's life was saved.

The Mass is a similar "operation." It is a "blood transfusion" of Christ's life into sick souls — the souls of the living on earth and the souls in Purgatory. Let us hasten their entrance into Heaven by having Mass said for their intention and by taking part in it ourselves by really Living Our Mass!


ALL SOULS ENROLLMENT

TRADITIONAL LATIN REQUIEM MASS FAURÉ'S REQUIEM NOVEMBER 2, 2021 - 7:00 PM

"It is as gentle as I am myself," wrote Fauré to a friend about his Requiem. Not for the classical models from Mozart to Cherubini, nor anything histrionic as in Verdi's dramatic Requiem, with its image of people cowering in terror, muttering of eternal death, and certainly not Berlioz's grandiose apocalyptic vision, with its thundering fanfares which Fauré held in horror.

"My Requiem expresses not so much the fear of death as the peacefulness of eternal rest, for this is how I see death—as a happy deliverance, an aspiration to higher joys, not a joyless transition to some ominous unknown."

It is a work of serenity and comfort: not even when the chorus voices fear of the Last Judgment (*Tremens factus*) is the music terrifying (though there has been harmonic tension at *Christe eleison* and strange modulations in the *Offertory* that have expressed legitimate unease at the thought of the pains of hell). This resigned mood is complemented by an unusual attitude to the work's form: "Having long played at funerals and knowing the services by heart, I wished to do something new."

Originally planning to commemorate the death of his father two years earlier, Fauré began the Requiem in 1887, but was impelled to complete his first version (with a smallish orchestra) when his mother died on New Year's Eve of that year. That form it was first heard at the Church of La Madeleine in Paris (where he was the organist) in January 1888.

This beautiful Latin Mass will be celebrated on Tuesday, November 2nd at 7:00 PM in our Parish and it will be offered for the repose of all the souls that are enrolled (whom you have given to us) and for those buried from our Parish last year (November 2021-November 2022).

I hope that many of you will avail yourselves of this spiritual opportunity to remember your dear deceased loved ones as well as to be uplifted yourself with the sound of this magnificent music performed by our Choir and Orchestra.

FRIENDS HELPING FRIENDS



NOVIEMBRE: MES DEDICADO A TODOS LOS MUERTOS

Cual sería su respuesta si alguien le preguntara: “¿CUANTAS VECES USTED ORA POR LOS MUERTOS?” Piense en eso. ¿Podría usted decir una vez al día, una vez por semana, una vez al mes? La mayoría de nosotros nos sentiríamos un poco avergonzados al responder. Sin embargo, así es la vida. Requiere mucho de nuestro tiempo y de nuestra atención. Raramente tenemos tiempo para compartir con personas que están a nuestro alrededor; mucho menos para orar por los que han muerto y que quizá hayan tenido un significado muy especial en nuestras vidas.

Nuestra “aparente negligencia” al no recordar a nuestros padres, familiares y amigos refleja simplemente que la vida sigue, que no se detiene. Significa que las distracciones y demandas de nuestras vidas, y las vidas de aquellos que nos rodean van a continuar ocupando la mayor parte de nuestros pensamientos y energías. Muy rara vez vamos a encontrar la oportunidad de orar o hablar con Dios sobre la madre, el padre, el hermano/na, amigo/a que ya no está con nosotros. Esta es la razón por la que la Santa Madre Iglesia designó el mes de noviembre para recordar a los difuntos.

El acto más grande de caridad que podemos llegar a tener por nuestros difuntos es orar y ofrecer Misa por ellos. *¿Por qué?* Porque las Misas van a permitir que sean alcanzados por la acción Salvadora de Cristo en la cruz, para ayudarlos a entrar al cielo si están en el purgatorio. El Catecismo Católico de la Iglesia la pone de esta manera: Todos los *que mueren en la Gracia y la amistad Dios tienen asegurado el cielo, sin embargo, si todavía no han sido purificados totalmente, después de la muerte tienen que experimentar la purificación, para alcanzar la santidad necesaria e incorporar la alegría del cielo.*

La iglesia da el nombre de purgatorio a la purificación final del elegido, que es totalmente diferente del castigo de aquellas personas que están condenadas por sus pecados. La iglesia formuló su doctrina de Fe en purgatorio especialmente en los consejos de Florencia y Trent. La tradición de la Iglesia, en referencia a ciertos textos de la Escritura, habla de un fuego de limpiamiento. *En cuanto a faltas pequeñas, debemos creer que, antes del juicio final, hay un fuego de purificación. El que es la Verdad dijo que quienquiera que pronuncie una blasfemia contra el Espíritu Santo jamás sera perdonado. Ni en esta vida ni en la otra. Con esta frase, podemos entender que ciertas ofensas se pueden perdonar en esta vida, y solamente ciertos otros pecados en la próxima. Esta enseñanza también se basa en la práctica de la oración para los muertos que se menciona en Sagrada Escritura. “Por lo tanto, Judas Macabeos, hizo la reparación para los muertos, por la que pueden ser perdonados.
