

My dear Parishioners,

Great men and women are usually humble men and women; or probably better, humble men and women are always great. Humility has a way about it. Although it is hard to achieve, we all love humble people.

There is Our Lord, the Blessed Mother, St. John the Baptist, St. Joseph...all humble, all loved, for centuries! They head the list. All the other saints, great and smaller, known or unknown, built their spiritual edifice on the foundation stone of humility. With civil leaders and heroes, it is the same. Take Abraham Lincoln for example. He was born humble and though he grew to great heights in the hearts of the people, he remained in his own eyes, small. No greater statesman ever lived, none more humble. In his youth he loved and trusted in God; he never outgrew these sterling qualities. The rail splitter followed in the footsteps of the Humble Carpenter. He understood well our Lord's very first exhortation: "Blessed are the poor in spirit..."

On the other hand, pride is the opposite of humility. It is an ugly monster, the first of all sins, the source of them all. It was pride that overcame some of the angels in the beginning; later our first parents fell because of it; and presently, it invades the world and runs it red with hate and blood. While we love a person who is humble, we despise one who is proud.

A young lady from America, somewhat of a nuisance, was touring Europe. While on the continent, the girl visited the home of the great master of music, Beethoven. She sat down at the piano of the great artist, and with an air of pride, played a part of his *Moonlight Sonata*. When she finished, she turned to an annoyed watchman of the house and said to him: "I suppose many great people come here?" The guide replied, "Yes. Paderewski was here last week." Then she asked, "Did he play on Beethoven's piano?" "No" said the old man, "he said he wasn't worthy." Fools rush in where angels fear to tread. And "in the mouth of a fool is the rod of pride."

Our Blessed Savior came into the world to overcome sin. Since sin springs from pride naturally He was humble. God, Eternal, Infinite, Almighty, lies helpless in a manger in Bethlehem...in the cramped quarters of our tabernacles. God who made and governs the marvelous heavens and earth was subject to two creatures, Mary and Joseph. He Who alone can unravel before our eyes the splendor of a tree, was nailed to one to die. His humility was such as was never seen or imagined or equaled before; it made Almighty God a Servant! *Do you want to be great? Do you want to become another Christ?* Then, follow Him by becoming humble!

As we prepare for the Feast of His Birth, put humility into practice by making a good confession! Put humility into practice by showing forgiveness toward those who may have hurt you! Put humility into practice by not lording it over others less fortunate than you! Yes, replace human pride with Christ's humility! More than that, replace your hurt with Christ's Heart! And give the old fool of pride a kick in the pants, according to an old prayer: "Dear Lord: Every time I look at me, I seem to see only me. Please, Lord: Kick me out of me. Please, Lord: So I can find some room for You in me!"

Share the Word Prayer Group


