THE SEASON OF ADVENT

By the time the Season of Advent begins, signs of Christmas are all around us and have been for several weeks. Unfortunately, the commercialization of Christmas many times distracts us from the true meaning of Advent. Advent is a time of gradual, reflective preparation for Christmas.

It is difficult not to get caught up in the crowded malls, the tinsel, and the colorful gift-wrap which are so much a part of the Season. It is a challenge to keep in mind that the celebration of Christmas is about God's boundless love for us as manifested in the gift of Jesus. The celebration of this event is so important that we set aside four weeks of preparation. Ironically, in the midst of all the rush and turmoil of the pre-Christmas time, God calls us to settle down and quietly reflect on the wonder of Jesus' coming. As Christians, we listen attentively to God's call to reflection. We take the time to pause, recollect ourselves, and renew our relationship with God. Our inner disposition is like that of the Israelites: we await the Messiah; as we wait, we trust God



will direct our lives, filling our lives with meaning. The world around us gives us cause to reflect in a special way during the Season of Advent. We find ourselves surrounded by the problems of war, incurable disease, hunger and homelessness. We live in a world where everyone is not equal or free. Perhaps, now more than ever, we need to stop to recognize and embrace the true inner peace that God offers us through Jesus. Advent can truly be a precious time for families to recognize anew Christ's peace within the home and within the heart of each individual family member. If families truly use the Advent Season for reflection, it can be a time for each family member to become closer to God and to one another. If Advent is dismissed, this time of the year can become simply a source of pressure and anxiety.

In the early Church, four different "comings" or manifestation of the Lord were celebrated all as one feast on January 6: His **Birth**, the visit of the **Magi**, His **Baptism** by John and His **Miracle** at Cana. The feast was named "Epiphany" –a Greek word meaning "showing, manifestation." Epiphany became, along with Easter, a traditional date for Baptisms. Just as Baptisms at Easter were prepared for by a time of fasting and penance (Lent), so the Baptisms at Epiphany were prepared for by a time of fasting and penance called "Advent" (from a Latin word meaning "coming"). Gradually, in many places, Christ's birth was given its own feast day on December 25 and the Season of Advent shifted to a time of preparation for this feast. Advent varied in length, but eventually, the practice of beginning on the fourth Sunday before Christmas became the norm. Gradually, Advent became less and less a carbon copy of Lent (fasting and penance) and more a time of prayer and reflection to appreciate the meaning of Christ's coming at Bethlehem, and His coming at the end of time. The vestments in Advent continued to be purple as in Lent, but the Gloria and Alleluia (eliminated during Lent) were sung, and the mood was less penitential. The symbol of this Season has become the Advent wreath, with the successive lighting of its four candles on each of the four Sundays – a sign of the approach of the birth of the Light of the World.

Whether you make your own or purchase one already made, the Advent wreath is a wonderful way for families to prepare for Christmas. The wreath, of course, is circular and its color is green. Its shape and color stand for God's everlasting love. The four candles –three purple and one pink- represent the four weeks of Advent. But, what do the colors of the candles mean? The color of purple tells us that Advent is a serious time for evaluating our lives. The color of pink says that we should approach Christmas with joy and hope. The increasing light of each week tells us that Jesus' coming is nearer and nearer. On the next page are suggested prayers that you and your family may want to use when lighting your Advent wreath at home.



Making the Advent Wreath

*Three purple candles and one pink candle (or four white candles, three tied with purple bows and the fourth tied with a pink bow).

*Four small candleholders (or a commercially available circular form which includes the candleholders).

*Evergreen branches (if commercial form is not used, these may be wound with wire to form a wreath). The candles should be placed at equi-distant points around the circle.



Blessing of the advent Wreath

Parent: God of Wonder, send down Your blessing on our family's wreath. May all of us who use it prepare a special place in our hearts for Christ's coming. May this wreath and its light remind us of Christ's promised coming. Send down Your many blessings on our family during this Holy Season.
All: We ask this in the name of Christ, Your Son and our Brother. Amen.

WEEK 1

(One purple Candle is lit. The following prayer is said)

Parent: God of Light, come, be our protector and our guide. Save us from all danger that might threaten us. Come into our hearts with Your light. Fill our hearts with love from one another.

All: We ask this in the name of Christ, Your Son and our Brother. Amen.

WEEK 2

(Two purple candles are lit. Then the following prayer is said)

Parent: God of Light, stir up our hearts and come. Make us ready for the coming of Your Son, Jesus. As we gather around our family wreath, we remember God's promise to always be with us. We know You are here, good and gentle God, and we thank You for loving us.

All: We ask this in the name of Christ, Your Son and our Brother. Amen.

WEEK 3

(Two purple candles and one pink are lit. Then the following prayer is said)

Parent: God of Light, come and enlighten the darkness of our minds. Be our strength and our guide. Renew us with Your love and help us to share Your love with one another.

All: We ask this in the name of Christ, Your Son and our Brother. Amen.

WEEK 4

(All four candles are lit. Then the following prayer is said)


Parent: God of Light, we continue to await Your coming into our hearts and into our Family. Come quickly so that through Your grace we may become more loving and peaceful.

All: We ask this in the name of Christ, Your Son and our Brother. Amen.



Also, it enables the Parish to provide Certificates of Eligibility to serve as Sponsors at Baptism and Confirmation.

REQUESTS FOR ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATES

The role of a sponsor is primarily a Spiritual role to model a Christian life for the child. Therefore, anyone requesting a certificate **must** be a registered, **participating** member of St. Gianna Beretta Molla Parish, a **practicing** Catholic in good standing (not living in violation of the Church laws), at least 16 years of age and **have received the sacraments of initiation** (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist). Please call the Parish office to make an appointment.

Sacrament of Marriage

Couples planning to marry at St. Gianna are expected to contact the Priest to arrange a date and time **FIRST**. Second, they must attend the Pre-Cana conferences as mandated by the Most Reverend Bishop. The period of preparation for marriage is a minimum of **six** months to ensure completion of all arrangements before the wedding day. Please contact the Parish office for more information.

Generalmente para cuando comienza el tiempo de Adviento, los signos de la Navidad ya comenzaron a rodearnos y desafortunadamente, la comercialización de Navidad, muchas veces, nos distrae del verdadero significado de este tiempo de preparación reflexiva para la Navidad.



Es difícil no quedar atrapado en los centros comerciales abarrotados de personas, con el ruido y el tragar en busca de ofertas que forman parte de la temporada navideña. Es difícil concentrar nuestra atención en la celebración de la Navidad que es simplemente la celebración del amor infinito que Dios nos tiene y que vemos claramente manifestado en el nacimiento del Niño Jesús. La celebración de este evento es tan importante que la Iglesia dedica cuatro semanas de preparación, irónicamente, en medio de toda la agitación de esta época. Si. En medio del ruido, Dios nos llama meditar y a reflexionar en silencio sobre el maravilloso nacimiento de Jesús.

Como cristianos debemos escuchar atentamente el llamado de Dios que nos invita a reflexionar, a hacer una pausa en nuestras vidas para renovar nuestra relación con Dios. Nuestra disposición interior debe ser como la de los israelitas: esperar al Mesías, y mientras esperamos, confiar en que Dios dirigirá nuestras vidas llenándolas con un significado propio. El mundo que nos rodea nos da motivos para reflexionar de manera especial durante el Adviento. Nos encontramos rodeados de problemas; guerra, enfermedades, hambre y falta de vivienda. Vivimos en un mundo donde todos no somos iguales ni gozamos de las mismas libertades. Quizás, más que nunca, necesitamos detenernos para reconocer y encontrar la paz interior que Dios nos ofrece a través de Jesús.

El tiempo de Adviento debe ser un tiempo donde las familias comparten la paz de Cristo en el hogar y en sus corazones. Debe ser un tiempo para reflexionar y para que cada miembro de la familia se acerque más a Dios y a los demás. Sin comprender el verdadero significado de Adviento, esta época del año puede convertirse en una época de depresión y ansiedad.

En la iglesia primitiva se celebraban cuatro diferentes "venidas o manifestaciones" en una sola fiesta, el 6 de enero: su nacimiento, la visita de los Reyes Magos, su bautismo por Juan y el milagro en Caná. La fiesta se llamaba "Epifanía" que en Griego significa manifestación. La "Epifanía" junto con la Pascua se convirtieron en épocas tradicionales para celebrar Bautismos. Así como los Bautismos en Pascua se preparaban haciendo ayuno y penitencia, también los Bautismos en Epifanía eran preparados con tiempo de ayuno y penitencia (Adviento) – de una palabra latina que significa "venir." Gradualmente el tiempo de Adviento tomó las características de ser un tiempo de oración y reflexión para apreciar mejor el significado de la bendición de Cristo. Las vestiduras de Adviento son púrpura como lo son en la Cuaresma pero el Gloria y el Aleluia que son eliminados durante la Cuaresma son cantados de un modo menos penitencial.

La corona de Adviento, hecha o comprada, es una maravillosa manera para que las familias se preparen para la Navidad. La corona es circular y su color es verde. Su forma y color representan el amor eterno de Dios. Las cuatro velas, tres violetas y una rosa, representan las cuatro semanas de Adviento. El color púrpura nos dice que el Adviento es un momento serio para evaluar nuestras vidas. El color del rosa dice que debemos acercarnos a la Navidad con alegría y esperanza. La luz creciente de cada semana nos dice que la venida de Jesús está cada vez más cerca.
