

From the Pastor's Desk

Anticipation of our Annual Forty Hours Devotion

"Let us, therefore, love God because God first loved us." 1 John 4:19)

lmighty God in His loving and wise Providence grants to us again the great privilege of being able to T make the Forty Hours Devotion. Ours is the gift of life, of health and of strength, enabling us to enjoy the happiness of serving and adoring our Divine Master present in the Sacrament of the Altar. During our Forty Hours this year, you will note that some who worshipped with us last year at the Forty Hours will not be here. That was their last Forty Hours. They have been taken from us in death. Rather a sobering thought! Some others, this Forty Hours, are lying on a bed of pain and sickness. The cross of sickness and ill health has been allotted them as a trial and a means of great grace. How they would love to be with us at our Forty Hours! They can only be with us in spirit and sacrifice. A number of our boys and girls are serving in the Armed Forces away from home. They may not be physically present but they will be with us in spirit. We are the fortunate ones. God has placed NO OBSTACLE in our way. No difficulty besets our paths. A triduum of joy and of love awaits us. Love on both sides. Christ will be here and so will we. Why? Because love is the reason, God's motive and ours. Because Christ loves us, He instituted the Blessed Sacrament and remains present under the Eucharistic species. Because we, on the other hand, love Christ so present, we have to come to adore and render Him our homage. "Let us, therefore, love God because God first loved us'' (1 John 4:19). For three days, as a united congregation, as one family, we shall be worshipping our Blessed Lord present in the Blessed Sacrament. By our faithfulness and devotion, we shall be giving testimony to our faith – to the fact of our sincere belief that in the Blessed Sacrament is the true Presence of the Body and Blood of Christ Himself. These will be three days when we will be present at Mass, happy days of procession and of fervent prayer. These will be days of confession and communion; days of adoration in which both the clergy and the laity will unite in adoration to our Eucharist Lord. This is all done for the purpose of giving public expression to an inward faith in the Most Blessed Sacrament.

What Does Our Lord Think?

hat the devout and faithful Catholic thinks of the Forty Hours is self-evident. Though we have many and various devotions throughout the year, we lovingly wait for the coming of our Forty Hours Devotion. I hope as you hear when Forty Hours will be celebrated, your heart skips a beat and a smile and feeling of pleasant anticipation will take possession of you. So, in evidence of our delight, we immediately turn to action. First, we begin by giving the church a thorough cleaning to make it spick and span! The walls, the pews, the floors will be waxed, etc. How about the altar and sanctuary? They will receive a good dusting and washing and freshly laundered and ironed altar linens are placed upon it with a beautiful antependium to adorn its front. All spotless and ironed to perfection! The candlesticks do not escape our scrutiny. They are scraped of accumulated wax and brand-new candles are put in them. The candles our first Communicants presented on their First Holy Communion day last May are placed in the candelabras representing their innocence and love for Jesus. We bring flowers and more flowers whose scents fill our church edifice and raise our mind and thoughts heavenward. Do not, for a moment, forget your Pastor for he also spends some solicitous moments. Upon him depends the good order for the Forty Hours. He must first arrange for a suitable preacher, and he knows he must be good and sound in Orthodoxy, for his parishioners expect something special for the Forty Hours. The choice is one of his big concerns. Then he must issue the invitations to visiting clergy and as host he must see to it that a proper table is set – one that will do honor to him and to his parishioners. The dual role of Martha and Mary falls on the pastor. The task is also his to see that in the church everything is as it should be and while solicitous about the spiritual side of the Forty Hours, he indeed, acts the part of Mary. In trying to fulfill his duties as host to visiting clergy he becomes the Martha, worrying himself about a multitude of household cares. And, so, it becomes a familiar sight for the people of the parish during the Forty Hours to see their pastor running all day and night between the church and the rectory.

Y ou may be sure he is the last one to leave the church after assuring himself that all the candles are extinguished and that the altar boys in their haste have not thrown the hot charcoal from the thurifer into the trash can! With this confidence that no danger of fire to the church exists, he murmurs, "Good night Jesus" and betakes himself to the rectory for a night of deserved rest, for it will be the pastor who will be up bright and early for the 8:00 a.m. morning prayer, lauds and exposition of the Most Blessed Sacrament. This is all said merely to refresh our minds and to make the picture somewhat clearer as to what we, the devout faithful, think of the Forty Hours Devotion. All these necessary preparations with the accompanying worry and anxiety, lovingly and willingly undertaken by all, go to prove that we love the Forty Hours Devotion and that in the life of our beautiful parish it is one of the most important events of the year. Catholics show by their actions that it is the purpose of the Forty Hours to publicly worship the most important Person connected with their existence and Who is none other than Jesus Christ, the Son of God! This much we take for granted.

But, I often ask myself, what our Blessed Lord thinks of the Forty Hours Devotion? Christ Our Lord is in heaven. He sits at the right Hand of God Almighty. From heaven He will look down upon our parishioners. There are the parishioners who will make the Forty Hours. The little children brought to church so devoutly by their parents. The altar servers making sure they are present for all their special assignments for Masses and holy hours. Then moms and dads who will try to come a little earlier from work so that after a long day they can get to church for evening Masses. What does our Lord think



about us who will make this devotion in His honor? I believe that our Blessed Lord will be greatly pleased with us. His Sacred Heart will beat with joy. Does not a father love to see his children? Does he not love to see his children gather to honor him? By that he judges that they are really his good children - that their hearts are in the right place and that they love him and show their love inwardly as well as outwardly. I firmly believe our Lord will very much be pleased with those of us who will make the Forty Hours because we have His word. "For where there are two or three gathered together in My Name, there am I in the midst of them" (Matthew 18:20). If He says that about two or three, how much more pleased will He be when He sees a huge number of people in our church. We know it to be an experience of life that when a person is happy, when he or she is pleased, one becomes more generous. For instance, take our parents. When do children ask them favors? Do they ask them for favors when they are cross or angry? No, but when they are pleased and happy. Our Lord is pleased and happy with us during our Forty Hours Devotion. Being pleased with us, He will be extremely generous with us. "And whosoever should give to drink to one of these little ones a cup of cold water only in the name of a disciple, Amen, I say to you he shall not lose his reward" (Matthew 10:42). We are giving God during our Forty Hours Devotion not only a cup of water, but all our love, all our service, all our adoration and worship. In return God will bless us, will reward us, will be generous with His Grace. Here is a practical thought. If there were anything that I desired very particularly from God, some favor or some grace, I would ask Him for it during the Forty Hours because I am sure He would grant it. I, Father Sunny, Father Opara, and Deacon George urge you to make the Forty Hours to make use of this time of grace to use every devotion for the benefit of your soul. Why do we exhort you so insistently that you make the Forty Hours Devotion? Because this may be the last Forty Hours that you are privileged to attend. Who of us knows whether he or she will live to attend another one? God only knows, and the matter rests in His Divine Hand. What assurance have we that the chance will be ours to make the Forty Hours next year?

here is one thing during the Forty Hours which is immensely pleasing to Our Lord and that is to make frequent visits to the Blessed Sacrament during the time of the Forty Hours. We will have clip boards available to sign up. But, you can come over and beyond the time you will sign up for. How pleasing these visits must be to our Eucharistic Lord! They are pleasing because you come by yourself, voluntarily, of your own accord. These friendly visits are times taken out by you for a personal visit to Christ Jesus. This hour of your visit is something unofficial and intimate and informal. It is a chance to hold a conversation with Our Lord; to tell Him your wants, worries, anxieties; your joys, happiness and consolations. You can place your problems and your burdens at the feet of Our Lord and Master. Perhaps you need courage to face a certain situation, strength to overcome a temptation. Have you a favor to ask for? Is some danger threatening the peace and bliss of your domestic life? Is someone ill? Grasp the chance offered to you by the Forty Hours Devotion. Our Parish was made official as a Parish in 1966 with Msgr. Charles C. Beausang serving as the first Pastor. It is over 56 years old. It was formed years ago by the sacrifice and generosity of generations of devout Catholics. Some founders of our Parish are dead. Now, we must make the generous sacrifice to keep our Parish vibrant and active. YOU are the Parishioners of today!! An interesting question though, "Who is the oldest parishioner of our Parish? This question is discussed often with animation and leads to interesting conclusions. But, I would like to answer the question and tell you "the oldest parishioner of our parish is Christ Jesus Himself." Of course, He is! In fact, I'm going back in history and say that Christ was the first parishioner in the Catholic Church. Was not the stable of Bethlehem the first Catholic Church? Was it not Christ's presence there that made that humble stable the first Church on earth? Your forbearers in the Faith built this Church urged on by their Faith and zeal. But, this building became a Catholic Church only when the first Mass was said in it and Christ descended on your Altar and Jesus's Real and True Presence remained in your Tabernacle. Without the Blessed Sacrament, our church would merely be a hall, a meeting place, a place of assemblage akin to the Protestant church edifices. At the reformation, the Protestants referred the Real Presence and so converted the temple of God into a mere auditorium. Christ was the first on



the altar of that church when it was built. His coming down from heaven on that first day made this building a Catholic Church. After all these years, He is STILL HERE, and if this Church stands another century, Christ in the Blessed Sacrament will be here. Christ is the oldest parishioner of any parish and Sacred Scripture gives up the reason: "My delight is to be with the children of men." Proverbs 8:31. It is my earnest and daily prayer that every single one of our parishioners will strive to make the Forty Hours Devotion. After we have made the Forty Hours, there certainly should be some change in us. The fruits of the Forty Hours are these - better Catholic men and women, better fathers, better mothers, better children – all holier, greater love, greater faith. Our Forty Hours Devotion should be a preparation for eternity. Jesus Christ, Our Lord, present in the Blessed Sacrament, help us to make a good Forty Hours Devotion.

When you begin your hour of adoration, make it for a special intention—perhaps you want to offer your hour for a son or daughter who is having problems or who has been away from the Church; for peace; for good health; for a job, etc....

Whatever it may be, the Lord is there to listen to you!

The Anointing of the Sick

and the Forty Hours

Sunday, October 22, 2023

On Sunday, October 22nd, we will open our Parish celebration of Forty Hours Devotion

i.e., Solemn Exposition of the Most Blessed Sacrament. We, the Priests of St. Gianna Beretta Molla Parish, invite you to be *a part* of these three very special days. They are days filled with Spiritual growth for you and your loved ones.



We will begin with our celebration on Sunday, October 22nd at 4:00 PM with the Sacrament of the Sick. The Sacrament of the

Anointing of the Sick is, as the words of St. James make clear, for the sick! It is no longer considered Last Rites. This Sacrament is for anyone who is sick, i.e., chronic sickness and also for anyone over the age of 65. In the Sacrament of the Sick, the Church extends the healing Hand of Christ to the sick. It is an encounter with Christ the Healer, Christ the Divine Physician. The woman in the Gospel was eager to touch only the Lord's cloak. "If I touch even His garment," she thought, "I shall be made well." The sick person today "touches" Him and experiences His power through the Sacramental Anointing. This Sacrament is NOT for people who are dead. It is for anyone who is ill. Won't you join us and welcome Christ into your life in this unique way? What more beautiful way to begin our "Forty Hours" than by recognizing Jesus, the Bread of Life, reserved in the Most Blessed Sacrament for our adoration and for the sick. The Anointing of the Sick will be administered during a special Mass on Sunday, October 22nd at 4:00 PM.



- 3. You hold the *Mass book*
- 4. You bring over the *cruets* of wine and water Father needs to offer Mass
- 5. You ring the *bells* so the people are alerted to the most important part of the Mass, the Consecration when the bread and wine become the Sacred Body and Blood of Christ
- 6. You carry the *cross* or *candles*
- 7. And so many other tasks you will be doing to make the Mass special and beautiful

To be an Altar server will allow you to feel a closeness to God and at the same time it will help you to become a responsible person, since you will have to be present at the Masses assigned for you to serve.

I will be training all the boys and girls who sign up to serve Mass so that they will know exactly what to do and be comfortable at the Altar.

Girls and boys will be installed as Altar servers at a special Mass during the celebration of the Parish 40 Hours Devotion, on Monday, October 23rd at 7 p.m.

L et me now sing of my friend, my friend's song concerning his vineyard. 

¡VENGAN A ADORARLO!

Mientras "navegaba" en la Internet, me encontré con este maravilloso artículo explicando la hermosa tradición de las "40 Horas". El Padre Saunders (Decano de la Escuela de Graduados Notre Dame de Christendom College y Pastor de Nuestra Señora de Esperanza en Sterling, Virginia) hizo un excelente trabajo al expli-



car el origen y propósito de esta Devoción a nuestro Rey de la Eucaristía! Leamos este articulo en preparación a nuestra Devoción de las 40 Horas que comienzan el domingo 22 de octubre a las 4 de la tarde.

La Devoción de las 40 Horas es un período especial de oración continua hecha ante el Santísimo Sacramento en Exposición solemne. El foco de esta devoción está en la Sagrada Eucaristía. Como católicos, las palabras de nuestro Señor arden en nuestros corazones: "Yo mismo soy el pan vivo que desciende del cielo. Si alguno come este pan, vivirá para siempre; el pan que daré es mi carne para la vida del mundo" (Juan 6:51). Afirmando nuestra creencia en la presencia real de nuestro Señor en el Santísimo Sacramento, el Concilio Vaticano II enseñó que la Sagrada Eucaristía es "la fuente y la cumbre de la vida cristiana" (Lumen Gentium, 11). Mientras la Misa es el acto central de adoración que nos hace participar en la Pasión, Muerte y Resurrección de nuestro Señor, el Concilio Vaticano II confirmó y animó la adoración del Santísimo Sacramento fuera de la Misa. Esta devoción deriva del sacrificio de la Misa y mueve a los fieles a la comunión sacramental y espiritual con nuestro Señor. Como bien lo expreso el Papa Pío XII en su encíclica Mediador Dei, "Esta práctica de adoración tiene un fundamento válido y firme". El número cuarenta siempre ha significado un período sagrado: las lluvias durante el tiempo de Noé duraron 40 días y noches; los judíos vagaron por el desierto durante 40 años, nuestro Señor ayunó y oró durante 40 días antes de comenzar su ministerio público. La devoción de las 40 Horas recuerda ese tradicional "período de cuarenta horas" desde el entierro de nuestro Señor hasta la Resurrección. De hecho, en la Edad Media, el Santísimo Sacramento fue trasladado al Repositorio "el Sepulcro de Pascua", durante este período de tiempo para significar el tiempo de nuestro Señor en la tumba. La Devoción de las 40 Horas comienza con una Misa Solemne de Exposición, que concluye con la Exposición del Santísimo Sacramento y una Procesión. El Santísimo Sacramento permanece en el altar en una custodia. Durante las siguientes 40 horas, los fieles se reúnen para la oración personal o pública en adoración a nuestro Señor. Un sacerdote puede ser invitado a dar una serie de homilías. Se deben ofrecer y fomentar las confesiones. Mientras que la devoción de 40 Horas nutre el amor de los fieles por nuestro Señor en el Santísimo Sacramento, tres dimensiones especiales han rodeado también esta devoción: la protección del mal y la tentación; la reparación de nuestros propios pecados y de las almas del Purgatorio; y liberación de calamidades políticas, materiales o espirituales. Aquí los fieles imploran a nuestro Señor que derrame Su Abundante Gracia no sólo para sí mismos, sino también para sus vecinos, no sólo por sus necesidades personales, sino por las del mundo. Esta es una maravillosa oportunidad para el crecimiento espiritual de cada persona y de la parroquia en su conjunto. En un mundo donde la tentación y el mal abundan, donde la devoción a la Misa y nuestro Señor en la Sagrada Eucaristía han disminuido, donde la práctica de la penitencia y la confesión han sido olvidadas, necesitamos la Devoción de las 40 Horas más que nunca.


